"I worked with Parker during summer school last year and we made good progress on a lot of his phonemic awareness skills. However, working through the rhyming section of Parker's pre-test this school year, he only got four out of ten answers correct. Like many students, along with summer learning loss, he has struggled with rhyming and often perceives rhyming as words with the same initial sound, rather than the same ending sound. Over the last three weeks, we focused on practicing rhyming to help him grow this skill. During our week three lesson, he answered all the rhyming questions correctly! When I told him his answers were correct, his face lit up with excitement knowing that he learned how to rhyme words."
